Celebrate Asian American and Pacific Islander Heritage month with a musical trip to the Philippines. Lou Ella Rose and members of the SamaSama Project explore how Filipino composers blended indigenous traditions with Western influences to resist Spanish and US colonial rule and reshape a distinct national identity. Through live music and storytelling, discover their lasting impact on Filipino culture and the arts.
